Subject:- Establishment of an Engineering College at Vidisha -
Grants-in-aid for -

Sir,

I am directed to refer to this Ministry's letter No. F.26-15/59-T.5, dated the 17th July, 1962 on the above subject and to inform you that on the recommendations of the Chairman, All India Council for Technical Education, the Central Government have approved the establishment of an Engineering College at Vidisha (Madhya Pradesh) for conducting 5 years degree course in Engineering with an annual intake of 120 students (Civil 60, Mechanical 30 and Electrical 30 and have assessed the requirements of the College for the purpose, as under:-



I. Non-recurring:

- a. Main buildings including Laboratories and workshops (1,22,900 sq. ft. plinth) Rs. 19,03,260
- b. Construction of Canteen (2,000 sq. ft.) and Cycl shed. Rs. 29,000
- Total (a) and (b) = Rs. 19,32,260
- c. Equipmen, including furniture, Library, Office equipment. Rs. 24,56,148
- Total Non-recurring: Rs. 43,88,408

II. Recurring (Ultimate) per annum: Rs. 6,40,248/-

The Central Government have agreed to share the non-recurring and recurring cost of the scheme of establishment of the college in the following manner:

Non-recurring

50% of the non-recurring expenditure on instructional buildings and equipment will be provided by the Central Government as grant-in-aid and the balance should be borne by the private enterprise and or the State Government in agreed proportion.

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Recurring:

50% of the net deficit in the recurring expenditure after taking into account income from tuition fees will be given as grant-in-aid by the Central Government for a period of 5 years from the date of starting of the College or implementation of the approved scheme for which assistance is given. The balance during the 5 years period and the entire deficit thereafter should be borne by the private enterprise and or the State Government in agreed proportion.

It is, however, noted that the Government of Madhya Pradesh have agreed to meet the entire non-Central Government part of the expenditure both recurring and non-recurring, vide their letter No. 764/933/CB/61, dated the 22nd February, 1961.

3. On the above basis, the respective shares of the Central Government and the State Government, in so far as the non-recurring cost of the scheme is concerned, will be as follows:

Central Government's share:

a. Buildings including Canteen Cycle shed	Rs. 9,66,130/-
b. Equipment etc.	Rs. 12,28,074/-
Total:	<u>Rs. 21,94,204/-</u> ✓

State Government's/Institution's share:

a. Buildings including Canteen Cycle shed.	Rs. 9,66,130/-
b. Equipment etc.	Rs. 12,28,074/-
Total:	<u>Rs. 21,94,204/-</u> ✓

4. In order to enable the institution to go ahead with the implementation of the Scheme, I am directed to convey the sanction of the President to the payment to you of the following amount as an 'on account' non-recurring grant towards the Central Government's share of the cost of implementation of the approved plan of the College subject to your acceptance of conditions of grant as give in the Annexure to this letter:-

For buildings:	Rs. 1,25,000/-
For equipment:	Rs. 75,000/-
Total:	<u>Rs. 2,00,000/-</u>

(Rupees two lakhs only).

5. The expenditure on account of the above grant is debitable to Major Head 27-Demand No. 84-S.R & C.A-A-Ministerial Departments - 14-Grants-in-aid, Contributions

Grant to Others: A.4(2)(2)-Grants to Scientific Societies and institutes - A.4(2)(2)(2)-Grants for Technical Education -Grants-in-aid to Non-Government Scientific and Technical Institutions for Development and Improvement (Plan Expenditure).

6. Funds in respect of the grant payable in Madhya Pradesh Circle of account will be re-appropriated from India Circle in due course.

7. The above mentioned grant is for the purpose outlined in the Annexure to this letter as per recommendations of the All India Council for Technical Education and is subject to the conditions stipulated therein. The above grant is subject to ^a further condition that the accounts of the institution should be open for a test check by the Comptroller and Auditor General at his discretion.

8. The bill(in duplicate) for the amount indicated in para 4 above may kindly be forwarded to this Ministry for countersignature of Shri M.V.D. Nair, Assistant Educational Adviser (Technical) to the Government of India, together with certificates to the effect that:

- (a) the conditions governing the grants are acceptable to the institution.
- (b) the amount will be spent for the object for which grants have been made; and
- (c) the institution will meet their share of expenditure with such assistance as may be made available by the State Government.

The countersigned bill should, thereafter, be presented for payment to the Treasury Officer, Vidisha, as early as possible. A specimen copy of form T.R.42 is enclosed for preparation of the bill.

9. The next instalment of the Government of India's grant will be paid after the amount of the present grant has been utilised together with the proportionate contribution of the State Government/Institution and the information about the non-recurring expenditure incurred furnished to this Ministry.

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10. The details of buildings, equipment, staff etc., for establishment of the College will be furnished to the institution separately direct by the Western Regional Office of this Ministry at Bombay. The plans of the new buildings of the College should be approved by the Public Works Department of the State Government and the expenditure thereon should be within the P.W.D. Schedule of rates.

11. Quarterly progress reports indicating the progress in respect of construction of buildings and purchase of equipment and expenditure incurred thereon should be furnished regularly through this Ministry's Western Regional Office at Bombay.

12. The amount of the above grant-in-aid will in all probability, be utilised within one Calendar year from the date of issue of the sanction.
